Titilayo Ogunbambi is a Gender Equality Advocate and the Executive Director of the Nonprofit, Boundless Hands Africa Initiative (www.boundlesshandafrica.org). She is a renowned social worker with cross-cutting experience in public policy analysis, advocacy, program development/implementing and project evaluation. Her focus have been advocating for gender equality and protecting women and children from abuse and violence.

Since 2016 BHA has been supporting women and girls, by providing all forms of assistance to victims, empowering them with skills, knowledge and tools to succeed, whilst raising the next generation of female leaders.

She is a ONE Champion, who is representing Lagos, selected by ONE; a global movement, campaigning to end extreme poverty and preventable disease. She has also been selected by the UN Women Nigeria, as one of the 25 young women (Beijing Eaglets) who will lead the feminist movement in Nigeria for the next 25years.

Through her numerous advocacy programs, her platform has allowed many women who are victims of domestic violence speak about their experiences and get access to justice. In addition, her initiative has rehabilitated over 67 women and young girls. She has enlightened and mentored over 1,500 young girls thus far, through her project 'Adolescent Leadership Series', that promotes sexual and reproductive health education among adolescents, which highlights on menstrual health counseling and distributes free menstrual pads for females.

Outside the numerous advocacies she carries out to educate young people on gender equality, she was invited by Young African Leaders Initiative (YALI) network to lead a three days Facebook chat on issues around gender-equality and gender-based violence in April, 2019. Through this, she was able to educate over 10,000 young people registered on the platform and answered over 200 questions related to the subject. She has led a training of trainers on gender-based violence, which trained about 70 young leaders.

She is a graduate of Public Administration from the reputable University of Jos, and holds a professional certificate in Nonprofit Leadership and Management from the prestigious Lagos Business School (LBS).
